The undersigned certifies and swears that he/she has just and reasonable grounds to believe, and does believe that the above named Defendant committed the following violation of law. On the 19 day of August, 2019 at 22:14 (Specifically include facts constituting cause for arrest.)

On 08/19/19 at approximately 0915 hour B.R.P.D. responded to (Colonnades at Glen Oaks subdivision) in the City of Boca Raton in reference an assault. Upon arrival, B.R.F.D. and B.R.P.D. uniform personnel located unconscious on the laundry room floor of her residence. had blunt force injuries to her head and severe burns to a majority of her body.

Det. Kurdys and I responded to the scene. Uniform personnel had made contact with the complainant/witness David Gonzalez (D.O.B. 08/21/70) on scene. Gonzalez was cooperative and advised me of the following. He is a delivery driver for JB Home Delivery. They are contracted to deliver appliances for Best Buy. Today he and his helper, later identified as Jorge Luis Dupre Lachazo (D.O.B. 06/06/98) delivered a washer and dryer to the residence. was the only one home. They removed the existing washer and dryer and installed the new equipment in the laundry room.

Shortly thereafter, Gonzalez heard multiple screams from inside the residence and noticed the overhead double garage door going down. Gonzalez became concerned and returned to the front door. He entered the home and immediately noticed blood on the laundry room/bathroom floor. He saw on the floor near the blood. Lachazo was the only one inside the residence. Lachazo was acting very strange and told Gonzalez

multiple times that they needed to leave. Gonzalez was in fear for his safety and stepped outside the residence. He immediately called his supervisor and then 911. Shortly thereafter Lachazo came outside, while Gonzalez was on the phone with the 911 dispatcher. Lachazo got in the delivery truck and fled the scene.

Responding uniformed personnel located a white box truck bearing Florida tag BMG-U70 exiting the Colonnades at Glen Oaks onto southbound St. Andrews Blvd. A traffic stop was conducted on the box truck at approximately 7100 W. Glades Road. The driver and sole occupant of the truck was positively identified as Jorge Luis Dupre Lachazo. Uniformed personnel on the traffic stop noted that Lachazo was very sweaty and was shaking, as if he was nervous. He was clad in blue shorts, which left his lower legs exposed. The hairs on both of his lower legs were burnt and the surface of his legs looked like they had ashes on them. Lachazo was transported to Boca Raton Regional Hospital by P.B.C.F.R. for medical evaluation. The white box truck was towed and secured pending the application of a search warrant.

Det. Kurdys responded to the Delray Beach Medical Center and met with husband, in the emergency room. gave consent to search his residence at in the City of Boca Raton. He signed a written consent card indicating the same. The consent card was placed into evidence.

I made the following observations on scene. The residence was a one-story home on the north side of The front of the home faces south. The double garage door was on the southwest side of the residence. The entry way door from the garage to the interior was on the northeast corner of the garage. Just inside the entry way was a small hallway. A bathroom/laundry room was immediately to the west. I observed blood on the tile floor of the bathroom/laundry room. There were low burn marks on the wooden door frame and on the lower portion of the washing machine. Burn marks and charred debris was observed in various locations on the tile floor within the room. A strong odor of a chemical was present. A wooden handled mallet was on top of the washing machine. Blood was observed on the mallet. A glass wine bottle was on the floor in front of the washing machine. Long hair was observed in the dried blood on the lower front portion of the washing machine and wine bottle. A pair of prescription glasses with bent frames were on the tile floor between the washing machine and the dryer.

The kitchen was directly to the north of the garage entry door. I observed the stove to be pulled away from the wall. A blue metal can of Acetone without the lid was on the kitchen counter. It should be noted that the white plastic lid to the Acetone can was located on the tile floor near the washing machine.

B.R.P.D. CST Greco responded to conduct the crime scene investigation. She documented the scene through photographs and measurements. She collected, packaged and submitted the evidence. While on scene CST Greco processed, the Acetone can for latent

finger prints. Latent prints were lifted and submitted for comparison. See the completed crime scene report for further details.

Det. Mick and I conducted a sworn video recorded interview with David Gonzalez at the Boca Raton Police Department. A copy of the interview was placed into evidence. The information that he provided was consistent with the information that is documented above.

Det. Mick and I conducted a sworn video recorded interview with Jorge Luis Dupre Lachazo at the Boca Raton Police Department. He was read in Constitutional Warning by Det. Mick. A copy of the interview and the Constitutional Warnings card were placed into evidence. The following is a brief synopsis of the information he provided.

Lachazo has worked for JB Home Delivery for approximately one year and eight months as a helper. Today he was in a truck with David Gonzalez. They did three deliveries in Boca Raton. The last delivery they were on was for the washer and dryer. He was inside the residence alone with the female resident, showing her how to operate the appliances. He admitted that he used the wooden handled mallet that was on top of the washing machine and struck her in the side of the head. She fell to the floor unconscious. Lachazo then went into the garage and closed the overhead door. He retrieved a chemical agent from the garage. He returned to the laundry room. Lachazo made a physical motion with his hands indicating that he doused and room with the chemical agent. He then made a motion with his hands that the chemical spontaneously combusted. He denied knowing the ignition source that was used to start the fire. He fled the residence, got into the delivery truck and drove off. It should be noted that Lachazo admitted to recently using cocaine, as well as marijuana through a vape.

B.R.P.D. Latent Examiner Flagler analyzed the latent impressions lifted from the Acetone can found on the kitchen counter. The latent prints were identified as those belonging to Jorge Luis Dupre Lachazo.

was admitted to the Trauma ICU with multiple skull and facial fractures. The blunt force trauma to the head caused a severe brain bleed. Additionally, she has second and third degree burns over the majority of her body. At this time is in extremely critical and grave condition. She has been placed in hospice care.

Based upon the above information and investigation, Jorge Luis Dupre Lachazo was charged with attempted second degree murder, contrary to F.S.S. 782.04(2), Aggravated Battery with a Deadly Weapon on a Person over 65 yrs., contrary to F.S.S. 784.08(1) and (2) (a) and Arson, contrary to F.S.S. 806.031(2).
